**Format & Results:**

Text from the 2004 Western Policies and Procedures

NDS In season Camp and Topolino Selection





For the 2004 January NDS junior camp in Lake Placid, quota six men and six women, and the Western Region nomination of one boy and one girl to Topolino, there will be a “J3 Shootout” time trial held in Park City, UT, December 28-30, 2004. Athlete selections will be made from the 2003-04 J3 JOs at Sun Valley, ID. The top 15 boys and top 15 girls who raced as J3s and remain J3s for the coming season will be ranked using the 25-1 ‘Old’ world cup scoring system. All three events will be scored. An individual’s score will be determined by totaling the best two of three results and ranking from highest points to lowest. The athletes ranked in the top 15 of this list will be invited to participate. In case of a tie(s) for the 15<sup>th</sup> position all tied athletes will be included in the invitation. Four alternates will be ranked continuing down the list. In case of athletes declining the invitation alternates may be included. The Regional Director will have a quota of up to 4 boys and 4 girls. The list will be published in advance. Intent to compete is due December 1, 2004.

The format of the event will be one day of training in Slalom and GS followed by one day of GS time trials and one day of SL time trials. Each competitor will have the opportunity to take three runs in each time trial. Each run will be scored separately using the “Old” 25-1 scoring system where the fastest time receives 25 points and the 15<sup>th</sup> fastest time receives 1. This system is described in detail in the USSA Alpine competition guide. The final ranking list is determined by adding the scores of the best 2 runs of GS and the best 2 runs of slalom together for each racer. That sum of points is the racer’s score. The highest total number of points scored in each gender is the time trial winner and the West’s nomination to the NDS for the Topolino competition.

In the event of a tie for first place it will be broken in favor of the higher total number of first places in the scored runs, that is the racer with the most wins (25 points) in his best 2 GS and Best 2 SL is the winner; if still tied, the total number of second place finishes (20 points) for the scoring runs highest number wins the tie; if still tied the total number of third place finishes (15 points) and so on continuing until one of the tied racers has a majority of some placing.

The NDS winter camp selection will be made by continuing down the result list until the Western quota is filled, based on the number of invitations received by the Western Region to the Camp. In the event of a tie for the last position the system described above for the Topolino nomination will be used to break the tie. In the event that qualified athlete(s) cannot attend the alternate list will be established in the same manner.
